Subject: Quarry County Park Master Plan – SMC Board Adoption

Since 2010 when Quarry Park entered the San Mateo County Park system as a 40+ acre park, it has expanded to become a 517 acre park with a master plan covering property that extends from ocean bluffs to the hillside park lands and flanks the communities of El Granada and Miramar.

San Mateo County Parks has prepared an extensive a master plan framework consisting of many specific projects. It defines an environmental review process for the individual projects will follow. This framework has been used in projects which have gone forward during the sixyear period that the Master Plan has been under development. The MCC recommend adoption of the plan presented. It is a good framework for guiding internal Quarry Park projects.

The SMC Parks Quarry Park Master Plan recognizes that Quarry Park and other open space areas that surround the community of El Granada and parts of Miramar are intertwined properties that have issues requiring the involvement of other SMC departments as well as other public agencies (attachment of details not included in this draft):

- Wildfire Risks
- Drainage and runoff
- Regional Trails, County Roads and Caltrans SR1
- On Street Parking by Parks users

In addition Quarry Park has three different projects that are unique within the Parks system and require extra support and public participation:

- Mountain Bike Trails
- Off Leash Dog Trails
- Pump Track

The MCC recommends that the Board of Supervisors, in addition to adopting the Master Plan for Quarry Park, take additional steps. This adoption should be accompanied by providing resources to allow the SMC Parks Director, together with other county resources, to review the additional concerns listed above and develop a plan to address these issues that can be presented to the community in 2023.
