1. (7:03) Board of Supervisors' Report and Comments from Other Public Officials

Our new supervisor Ray Mueller was present and led a discussion regarding the December 30th to January 18th storm:

- A. Important post storm actions:
 - Get individual damage assessments for homes.
 - There will be an SMC Alert, coming out to people to know what number to call.
 - County officials have been asked to reach out to make sure that those assessment numbers for homeowners are accurate
 - SBA small business loans will be available. Disaster loans will be available for those with Agar ranch damage.
- B. Connectivity issues and reasons for loss were discussed.
 - Loss of Verizon and Comcast.
 - Hotspot cellular towers were deployed.
- C. Transportation issues were discussed.
 - Sinkhole on 92 resulting in one way traffic, Emergency vehicles only during some parts of the storm.
 - Landslide at Devil's Slide.
 - Downed trees. Call 211 to report.
 - Flooding issues on the Mid coast. Need for more retention or detention facilities that contain storm water runoff.

A need was identified to increase the capacity of the urgent care center in Moss Beach with more emergency room availability.
