## Gun Buyback Set for Dec. 9 in Belmont

- The County and partners are holding an anonymous gun buyback on Saturday, Dec. 9, at 400 Harbor Blvd., Belmont (Google map link.)
- From 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., law enforcement officers will accept all guns, no questions asked, in exchanged for cash: \$50 for nonfunctioning firearms; \$100 for handguns, shotguns or rifles; \$200 for assault weapons as classified by the state of California.
- To those planning to attend, transport firearms unloaded and in the trunk of your vehicle.

**Flu, COVID-19 and RSV** With respiratory virus season upon us, County Health and the Association of Bay Area Health Officials encourages everyone to take steps to prevent flu, RSV and COVID-19.

- Stay up to date on vaccines. Vaccines are the best defense against severe illness and death and you can get all at the same time. Visit <a href="MyTurn">MyTurn</a> to schedule vaccines or contact your health care provider.
- Flu and COVID-19 vaccines are available for everyone 6 months and older and have been updated to protect against new variants.
- RSV immunizations are now available for infants and young children, pregnant people and adults 60 years and older.
- Stay home if you're sick. Staying home when you're sick slows the spread of flu, COVID-19, RSV and even the common cold.
- Test and treat. Test for COVID-19 and flu if you have symptoms. If you test positive, contact your health care provider and ask about prescription treatments.
- Consider wearing a mask. Masks can slow the spread of respiratory viruses. If you or your family member are at high risk for severe illness, consider wearing a mask, especially in public indoor or crowded spaces. See more from the <u>California Department of Public Health</u>.

## Don't Pack a Pest During the Holidays

- The San Mateo County Department of Agriculture/Weights and Measures asks residents to not transport fresh fruits and vegetables from the following <u>fruit fly</u> quarantine zone counties: Los Angeles, Ventura, Sacramento, Riverside, San Bernardino, Contra Costa, and Santa Clara.
- Personal travel is one of the primary avenues for the spread of damaging invasive species and all residents are urged to adopt the principles of "Don't Pack a Pest" to help prevent future introductions of invasive pests and diseases.
